Operation Anzac Day Random Breath Test Results

Operation Anzac Day 2006 targeted drink driving related offences across the State commencing 12.00 Midday on Tuesday 25 April. Over 230 uniform police officers were deployed across 69 random breath testing sites over 12 hours.

The results for Tuesday 25 April 2006 for the period 12 noon to 11.59 p.m. are as follows:

Notable Reports:

- 61% of the PCA offenders recorded a BA level of 0.08% or more.
- A total of 22 drivers had their licences disqualified 'On the Spot' as a result of drink driving. 13 motorists recorded a Blood alcohol level between 0.08 and 0.149. and 8 motorists recorded a BA level of 0.150 or more. One motorist was also reported with 12 month licence disqualification for fail to comply with BA requirements.
- The highest reading for the night was a woman driving at Anzac Highway, Adelaide who recorded a BA level of 0.195%.
